## Letter from the Rectory - Rev'd Liz

Lots of us have been saying, 'I can't wait to we get back to normal.' I have to say that visiting my mum last week, a previously 'normal' experience, was joyous. With the exception of Christmas Day I hadn't seen her for 8 months and I am thankful for a warm, sunny day, so that we were able to sit comfortably outside. It wasn't quite the 'normal' experience, though, as I couldn't give her a hug. But it was still lovely.

As well as talking about 'getting back to normal', people have started talking about 'the new normal'. One of my 'new normals' is Zoom which has enabled me to chat with friends scattered far and wide. I'd never even heard of Zoom till the pandemic.

For others, the 'new normal' has been the flexibility of being able to work from home (acknowledging it doesn't suit everyone) – while others have got into daily walking and feel better for it.



But am I right to look for the positive in what has been such a devastating experience? Or am I just trying to look on the bright side – trying to see the glass as half full as opposed to half empty?

Some of us may not feel ready to see the possibility of anything positive coming out of the last year – the loss of so many things that Covid has brought is still felt too keenly, and the situation we are currently seeing in India and South Asia remind us that the pandemic is still with us and causing deep grief. It is right to lament for the terrible loss that has taken place and is still taking place. But maybe in the not too distant future we can also begin

to hope for the day when we can allow ourselves to recognise that some good can come out of this terrible situation. In the Christian narrative we call this redemption: the belief that God can transform something that seems utterly dark into something of light and goodness. The clearest example of this is seen in Jesus's crucifixion and death followed by his resurrection. We all experience situations in life where we hope redemption can happen.

This isn't a glib optimism that 'everything will turn out ok.' The last year has shown us that for so many people things haven't work out ok. But we continue to hope that darkness will not have the last word, reminding ourselves that in Christ 'the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it'.

For good to come out of this period of human history we will need to reflect on it and learn from our experience – individually, as communities and as a species. Maybe this will also help us as we face the arguably bigger problem of climate change.

The Bishop of Leeds, our diocesan bishop, Nick Baines, asked us to reflect on the following questions:

- What have we lost that we need to regain?
- What have we lost that needs to stay lost?
- What have we gained that we need to keep and build upon?
- What have we gained that we now need to lose for the future?

You may find these questions useful for yourself, or your organisation. Being honest with ourselves about both the good and the bad will help us all to move forward. Blessings to you all.



# Weddings and Funerals Update: (subject to change) Weddings

From **17 May** at the earliest, up to 30 people will be allowed to attend weddings (depending on the size of the building; less if the venue is small)

From **21 June** at the earliest, the government aims to remove all limits on social contact, including lifting wedding restrictions.

However, the guidance may be that masks will remain compulsory, and congregational singing may still not be allowed. We await further announcements.

**Funerals** are limited up to a maximum of 30 up to 21 June at the earliest, though this could be less depending on the capacity to safely socially distance in each particular church building or crematorium. Up to 15 people are allowed at the interment of ashes.

Funerals directors have current information on government guidelines, and parish policies, which vary.

## **Bird notes from Richard Wells**

For a birdwatcher there is no more exciting time than the spring – the arrival of our summer visitors after long and sometimes perilous journeys lasting thousands of miles.



Just think about birds like **chiffchaff (above left)** and **swallow (above right)** – smaller than sparrows - which have survived the African heat of our winter and then set off over deserts and seas to arrive here...and all we offer them is a lot of depressingly cold weather.

But they are here. Frank Johnston got the ball rolling with two wheatear (right – female and male) at Pinkers Pond on the early



date of March 18. Three days later a chiffchaff was heard in the garden of the Blue Lion in East





Witton and by the end of the month **blackcap (left, male and female)** and the first **sand martins (right)** were in our parishes.

Swallows were a bit later – the first I heard of was a pair at Sowden Beck on April 9. And Sam Anderson had the first house martin (below left) a few days after that.



Then there was a bit of a lull, no doubt caused by those cold days and even colder nights when the migrants held back from venturing further north. So cold was it that winter fieldfares made a brief appearance, no doubt having their last taste of local insects before heading off to Scandinavia for the summer. After that, the next summer migrant to appear was a male redstart (r) at the Stepping Stones between Middleham and East Witton on April 20. By my reckoning that is

about a week later than when they normally arrive.



In other news, Janet and Robert Harker were delighted to see a **nuthatch** (**left**) enjoying the bird feeder in their garden in Melmerby in mid-April; I reckon there are at least three pairs of **mandarin duck** (**right**) looking to nest along the rivers Cover and Ure, a **marsh tit** (**left**) singing in Cover Gorge was a highlight for me. And finally, when the Stocken family



told me about two **kingfishers (below r)** they had seen on the River Ure at the end of

February I assumed that would be the start of lots of sightings of this colourful bird in our parishes. But I haven't seen one this year. Very unusual. Am I alone?

## **Dales Police Report**

Firstly, an update on the planned move of Leyburn Police Station to the shared facility at Leyburn Fire Station. The sharp eyed amongst you will have noticed that this has not happened yet. It is still going ahead but has been delayed due to a technical problem with IT. We will keep you posted as to when we are moving.

The last month has seen little in the way of crime. One stand out offence was the theft overnight on 23<sup>rd</sup> March of 10 chimney pots, valued at over £500, from outside Cellar Antiques in Hawes. Please contact us with any information.

We have taken a number of reports of attempted scams. Please remember that a genuine bank or organisation will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, full password or to move money to another account. Only give out your personal or financial details to use a service that you have given your consent to, that you trust and that you are expecting to be contacted by. Also, don't be tricked into giving a fraudster access to your personal or financial details. Never click on a link in an unexpected email or text. And finally, always question uninvited approaches in case it's a scam. Instead contact the company directly using a known email or phone number. If you have been affected by fraud, report it to Action Fraud (0300 123 2040 or <a href="https://www.actionfraud.police.uk">www.actionfraud.police.uk</a>).



## Retiring

On a personal note, I shall be retiring in May from the police and my role as Beat Manager and Wildlife Crime Officer at Leyburn. I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the many past and present colleagues who I have worked with in the last 29 years, and whose support and friendship has been much appreciated. Policing is a unique and varied career, with many challenges. When I joined we were largely focused on crime, whereas your average officer today has a wide range of demands, not only investigating crime and disorder,

but also working with partners to safeguard victims and the vulnerable. Personally, when dealing with people I have always tried to work on the principle that behaviour breeds behaviour. This approach must have had some success as I very rarely needed to draw my truncheon, and was only shot at once (he missed!). A big thank you to the dedicated volunteers, such as Dales Watch, who help to keep crime levels low, and Swaledale Mountain Rescue Team, who are always there to help with the seemingly impossible. They are just two examples of the support which is freely given in our amazing Dales. Others, such as my friends in the Yorkshire Dales National Park and RSPB deserve a mention, but this risks becoming an Oscar acceptance speech!

## **Hospital Transport**

Parish support groups may be able to provide transport to local medical/ dental practices. Different parts of the area have their own arrangements so contact your parish council to see if they can support in this way. In Middleham contact David Keep 07531580499 or <a href="mailto:office@middlehamtowncouncil.co.uk">office@middlehamtowncouncil.co.uk</a> in the first instance.



If you have an appointment at one of the hospitals for our district, and no family or friends are available to help, you will be asked to contact PTS (Patients Transport Service) which is provided by Yorkshire Air Ambulance (0300 3302000 between 8am – 6pm). They accept the most critically ill people within the following criteria: outpatients; admission or discharge from hospital; regular life-saving treatment e.g. dialysis, chemotherapy. PTS are reluctant to speak to anyone but the patient who must have appointment details when they phone. PTS is free of charge.

If none of the above is possible, contact the Leyburn Hub on 01969 624510 or <u>admin@leyburnartscentre.com</u> The Hub has arranged to provide transport via NYCC Transport Service run by volunteers, but is not free of charge. For journeys up to 44 miles, the charge is 45p a mile. For journeys more than 44 miles, the charge is capped at £20. Pay the driver by cash or cheque at the end of the journey.

## **Sheltered Housing, Lifeline and Telecare**

## **Sheltered Housing**

Sheltered housing accommodation is designed for older and disabled people. It enables residents to lead an independent lifestyle in a setting which encourages social interaction with

the benefits of support from an on site warden and emergency alarm system.

Accommodation varies from scheme to scheme, but generally there are one and two bedroom flats, bungalows and fully self contained studio flats available.

#### Locations - The council has sheltered housing schemes in:

St Cuthberts Green, Barton
 Queen's Court, Richmond

St Edmunds Close and Brompton Court, Brompton on Swale

Noels Court, Catterick Village
 Oak Tree Court, Colburn

Thornborough Hall Gardens, Leyburn
 Quaker Close and Lanthorne, Reeth

#### Lifeline

Lifeline is a service run by the council which provides reassurance, emergency support and peace of mind to its users, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.



It is available to anyone over 60, disabled people and residents returning home from hospital who require some back up support during their convalescence.

Lifeline provides people with a special unit which connects them via the telephone network to a call centre. Customers can summon help at any time by pressing either of the alarm trigger buttons supplied with the unit.

The operator at the call centre talks to the caller, giving them reassurance and will summon further help if required. The help the operator can provide ranges from giving verbal reassurance, to contacting a friend, neighbour, relative, mobile warden or the medical and emergency services.

There is a charge for the lifeline service. For more information on the help

available contact 01748 901147.

#### **Telecare**

Telecare also helps people live independently in their home. It may help by fitting some equipment with a wireless link to a lifeline - a type of telephone. This equipment can automatically tell the telephone to make an alarm call if help or support is needed.

Telecare equipment can raise the alarm to a specialist centre 24 hours a day. Trained operators will have users' information and know who to call in an emergency. Like the lifeline system this could be family, friends, carers or the emergency services.

#### **Equipment**

Some of the equipment which can be provided and details of how it can help include:

- Smoke Detector: wireless smoke detector can raise the alarm in cases of fire
- Fall Detector: will identify a fall and get help quickly
- Flood Detector: can identify an overflowing bath or sink

There is a charge for the lifeline service. Any additional telecare equipment is also subject to a small additional charge.

## The Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes

...will reopen on 17 May with a special exhibition telling the story of schools in the Upper Dales.



A blockbuster photo mosaic made from nearly 2,300 images of youth and school-life in the Upper Dales will greet you on entry.

A Mosaic of Dales Youth was created by The People's Picture, an art and design studio led by artist Helen Marshall. The photo tiles come together to reveal a whole new image selected by Marshall - portraits of David Hodgson of Askrigg School, aged 7 in 1954, and Joan Miller of Yorebridge Grammar, aged 12 in 1946.

'The Story of Schools in the Upper Dales' is also told through interpretation boards, vintage and modern photographs, a short film and oral histories. Themes include the changing journey to school, the tension between learning and earning and the life of teachers, 'Kiddy Catchers' and bus drivers.

Fourteen oral history interviews took place with well-known local people who attended Upper Dales schools from the 1930s onwards.

'Recording their stories has been a project highlight,' said project manager, Emily Rowe Rawlence. 'The exhibition is full of anecdotes, from filling pockets with bullets in WWII, to walking alone through brutal weather two miles to school and back at only five-years-old, to being sent down the pub to buy cigarettes for the headmaster at breaktime. Each person had a fascinating story to tell of a Dales childhood in the 30s, 40s, 50s or 60s. Together with the giant photo mosaic that is four and a half metres wide, they bring the last century to life.'


