Now that the school holidays and summer visitor season are in full swing, please be considerate when parking on the Town Wastes in the town centre

Parking is on a "first come first served basis" for everyone, resident or visitor. Nobody has any special rights e.g. to park outside their own house. Nobody should be putting cones, benches or planters out to try to keep communal space just for themselves nor parking badly to try to occupy two spaces.

We have looked at any and every possible place for additional parking and there is nowhere available. We cannot magic up extra land within the town for a car park so it really does need everyone to be patient and polite and share the space there is, please.

You may have noticed that last week a new bin was installed near the school close to the junction of Park Lane and the Springs. It's a combined general waste and recycling bin and was purchased by the Town Council following residents feedback that an additional bin in that area was needed. The District Council will empty the bin.

From Middleham Key Centre Trustees Future of the Key Centre

Earlier this year, after the Key Centre Trustee
Board stood down, 5 of your Town Councillors
came forward to ensure continuity. The initial
priority for the new trustees has been to carry
out a business review and, whilst this is not yet
complete, it has become clear that following
Covid, demand for business office space in rural
areas and use by community groups has
significantly reduced. As things stand, the Key
Centre spends more money than it currently
earns and whilst, fortunately, there are no debts,
this position is clearly unsustainable and at some
point, funds may run out.

The Trustees have successfully renegotiated contracts to reduce outgoings and continue to let function rooms to residents and others alongside our current regular groups. A more radical solution however is required to ensure longer term viability and the Trustees and Council are exploring all options, including potential for sharing use of the building. These investigations

are at an early stage – please be reassured that the aim is that these will continue to include a community space, albeit a smaller and hopefully more sustainable one.

The Key Centre is Middleham's community centre. Council and the trustees intend to share their thoughts and plans and seek feedback from residents, current user groups and potential users. Feedback may be sought in the form of a questionnaire. It is also planned to organise a town meeting; many residents will remember the very well-attended public meeting 5 years ago to discuss the future of the playing fields which lead to a rejuvenated Sports and Community Wellbeing Association.

Further announcements will be made when there is more to report and the Trustees and Council are in a position to recommend a plan.

In the meantime, the Key Centre is mostly run by volunteers: are you able to give up some of your time to, for example, maintain the front garden, help with laying out chairs and tables for events? If you are able to help, in any way, please contact Pam Avison (01969 624002) Sue Fairhurst (07896321348) or Honor Byford (07849918215) for an initial chat.

How do you keep cool when it gets hot, hot, HOT?? One way is to visit our beautiful church in Middleham. The thick walls and high windows somehow keep it pleasantly cool when 'it's cracking flags' outside. Everyone is welcome to come and cool off, maybe to enjoy the peace too and have a few moments to yourself, maybe to think, reflect, pray, or just sit. Have a little look around if you've not been in before, or even if you have. St Alkelda is buried in the church, the windows are beautiful and tell dramatic human stories from the Bible, and there is also a copy of 'the Middleham jewel' in a cabinet at the back of the church. The church is open every day from approximately 9am to 5pm, shutting a little earlier in the winter months. Everyone is welcome, and canine friends are welcome too.
